Introduction

1 ORGANIZATION AND ACTIVITIES

1.1 General Information

The Company is a "Closed Joint Stock Company" registered in Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia under Commercial Registration no. 1010573360 dated 9 Shaban 1440 (H) corresponding to 15 April 2019 (G).

The Company is wholly owned by Mobile Telecommunications Company Saudi Arabia ("Parent Company"). The ultimate parent company of the Company is Oman Telecommunications Company SAOG, Oman.

The Company is engaged in providing consumer finance services in accordance with the approval of Saudi Central Bank ("SAMA") numbered 57/A SH/202012 issued on 15 Jamada Awwal 1442 (H) corresponding to 20 December 2020.

The duration of the Company is 49 years starting from the date of registration of the Commercial Registration.

The registered address of the Company is P.O. Box 295814, Riyadh 11351, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

On 1 Safar 1441 (H) corresponding to 30 September 2019 (G), the Company was converted from Limited Liability Company to Closed Joint Stock Company. During 2020, the name of the Company was changed from "Zain Payments Company Ltd" to "Tamam Finance Company".

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION

The interim condensed financial statements of the Company as at and for the period ended 30 June 2022, have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 - Interim Financial Reporting ("IAS 34") as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and other standards and pronouncements issued by the Saudi Organisation for Chartered and Professional Accountants ("SOCPA"). These interim condensed financial statements do not include all the information and disclosure required in the annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2021. The interim results may not be an indicator of the annual results of the Company.

These interim condensed financial statements have been presented in Saudi Riyals ("SR"), which is also the functional currency of the Company.

The accounting and risk management policies adopted in the preparation of these interim condensed financial statements are consistent with those used in the preparation of the annual audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2021.

3 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Company has applied the same accounting policies and methods of measurements in its interim condensed financial statements as mentioned in its annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2021 (last year annual financial statements).

Use of estimates and judgements

There have been no material revisions to the nature and amount of estimates of amounts reported in prior periods.

Management believes that all sources of estimation uncertainty remain similar to those disclosed in the last annual financial statements. The Company will continue to monitor the situation, and any changes required will be reflected in future reporting periods.

New standards, interpretations and amendments adopted by the Company

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the interim condensed financial statements are consistent with those followed in the preparation of the Company's annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2021, except for the adoption of new standards effective as of 1 January 2022. The Company has not early adopted any standard, interpretation or amendment that has been issued but is not yet effective.

Several amendments and interpretations apply for the first time in 2022, but do not have any impact on the interim condensed financial statements of the Company.

Amendments to IAS 1: Classification of Liabilities as Current or Non-Current

In January 2020, the IASB issued amendments to paragraphs 69 to 76 of IAS 1 to specify the requirements for classifying liabilities as current or non-current. The amendments clarify:

- What is meant by a right to defer settlement
- That a right to defer must exist at the end of the reporting period
- That classification is unaffected by the likelihood that an entity will exercise its deferral right
- That only if an embedded derivative in a convertible liability is itself an equity instrument would the terms of a liability not impact its classification

The amendments are effective for annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2023 and must be applied retrospectively. The Company is currently assessing the impact the amendments will have on current practice and whether existing loan agreements may require renegotiation.

Reference to the conceptual framework - Amendments to IFRS 3 Business Combinations'

The amendments replace a reference to a previous version of the IASB's Conceptual Framework with a reference to the current version issued in March 2018 without significantly changing its requirements.

The amendments add an exception to the recognition principle of IFRS 3 Business Combinations to avoid the issue of potential 'day 2' gains or losses arising for liabilities and contingent liabilities that would be within the scope of IAS 37 Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets or IFRIC 21 Levies, if incurred separately. The exception requires entities to apply the criteria in IAS 37 or IFRIC 21, respectively, instead of the Conceptual Framework, to determine whether a present obligation exists at the acquisition date.

The amendments also add a new paragraph to IFRS 3 to clarify that contingent assets do not qualify for recognition at the acquisition date.

These amendments had no impact on the interim condensed financial statements of the Company as there were no contingent assets, liabilities and contingent liabilities within the scope of these amendments arisen during the period.

Property Plant and Equipment: Proceeds before intended use – Amendments to IAS 16

The amendment prohibits entities from deducting from the cost of an item of property, plant and equipment, any proceeds of the sale of items produced while bringing that asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management. Instead, an entity recognises the proceeds from selling such items, and the costs of producing those items, in profit or loss

These amendments had no impact on the interim condensed financial statements of the Company as there were no sales of such items produced by property, plant and equipment made available for use on or after the beginning of the earliest period presented.

IFRS 9 - Financial Instruments - Fees in the '10 per cent' test for derecognition of financial liabilities

The amendment clarifies the fees that an entity includes when assessing whether the terms of a new or modified financial liability are substantially different from the terms of the original financial liability. These fees include only those paid or received between the borrower and the lender, including fees paid or received by either the borrower or lender on the other's behalf. There is no similar amendment proposed for IAS 39 Financial Instruments: Recognition and Measurement.

These amendments had no impact on the interim condensed financial statements of the Company as there were no modifications of the Company's financial instruments during the period.

12 IMPACT OF COVID-19

The Company is continually monitoring its impact, while working closely with the local regulatory authorities, to manage the evolving business disruption of the COVID-19 pandemic.

In light of COVID-19, the Company has considered whether any adjustments and changes in judgments, estimates and risk management are required to be considered and reported in the condensed interim financial information. Below are the key assumptions about the future and other key sources of estimation that may have a significant risk of causing material adjustments to the condensed interim financial information.

Impairment of non-financial assets

The Company has considered any impairment indicators arising and any significant uncertainties around its property and equipment and concluded there is no material impact due to COVID-19.

Expected Credit Losses ("ECL") and impairment of financial assets

The Company has considered the impact of COVID-19 in the ECL models by applying probability weightage scenarios on the relevant macroeconomic factors relative to the economic climate of the respective market in which it operates. The Company has also assessed the exposures in potentially affected sectors for any indicators of impairment and concluded there is no material impact on account of COVID-19.

Commitments and contingent liabilities

The Company has assessed the impact of any operational disruptions, including any contractual challenges and changes in business or commercial relationships among customers and suppliers, with a view of potential increase in contingent liabilities and commitments and no issues were noted.

Going concern

The Company has performed an assessment of whether it is a going concern in the light of current economic conditions and all available information about future risks and uncertainties. The projections have been prepared covering the Company's future performance, capital and liquidity. The impact of COVID-19 may continue to evolve, but at the present time the projections show that the Company has ample resources to continue in operational existence and its going concern position remains largely unaffected and unchanged from 31 December 2021. As a result, this interim condensed financial information has been prepared on a going concern basis.

13 EVENT AFTER THE REPORTING PERIOD

During the period ended 30 June 2022, the Board of Directors resolved to increase the share capital of the Company from SR 57 million to SR 148 million through transfer from amount due to partner. The increase in capital was approved the Saudi Central Bank via letter 43102505 dated 19 Dhu Al-Hijjah 1443H (corresponding to 18 July 2022).

No other events have occurred subsequent to the reporting date and before the issuance of these interim condensed financial statements which requires adjustment to, or disclosure, in these interim condensed financial statements.
